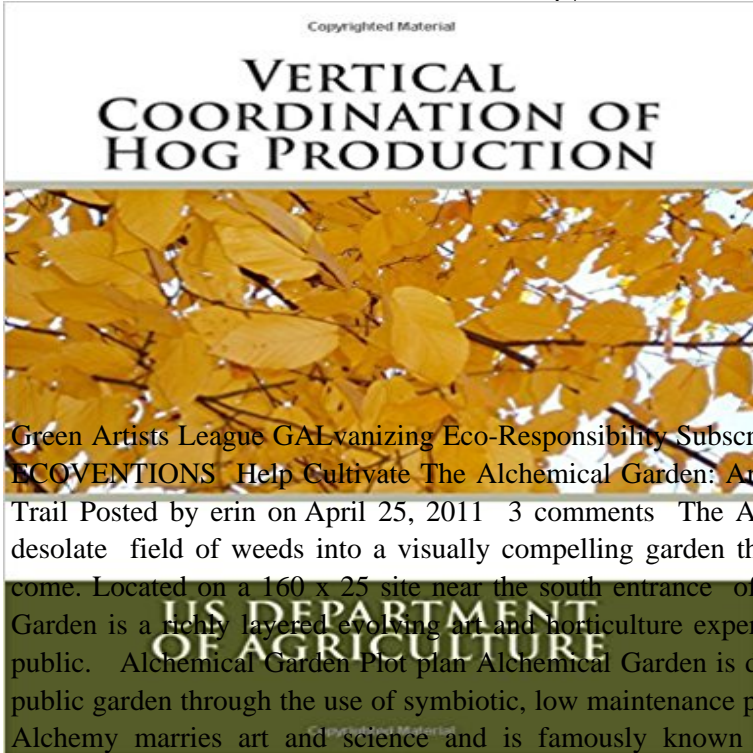


Vertical Coordination of Hog Production
